First performed in Paris at the Théâtre Feydeau, On the 1st ventôse, year 6 of the French republic (February 19, 1798)

CHARACTERS, ACTORS.

DOM FERNAND, minister and Spanish noble man
DOM PIZARE, Governor of a State prison
FLORESTAN, prisoner
LÉONORE, wife of Florestan and key-carrier under the assumed name of FIDÉLIO
ROC, jailer
MARCELINE, daughter of Roc
JACQUINO, doorkeeper in love with Marceline

Prisoners, a Captain of the Guards, Gardians, People.

The scene takes place in Spain, in a State prison, a few miles from Seville.

WEEK ONE:

SCENE I: MARCELINE, JACQUINO

MARCELINE, (pressing clothes and looking at the door every time one knocks at it)

Fidélio is not coming back... he had so many errands! Well, it is today that my father must decide the day of my marriage with him!...Of all the days of my life, that one will be the nicest...I will live with Fidélio, the key-carrier and with father, the jailer. Me, the laundress of the prisoners...(She makes a motion indicating that this is a profession which brings lots of money.)

No.2 Couplets of Marceline: "Fidélio mon doux ami...", Tempo di Minuetto Seguidilla, 3, g minor

1st Couplet, g minor

Fidelio, my sweet friend
How I long to be your wife
A girl, alas, can only half
Admit what is in her heart
But to caress you without blushing,
To hug you in my arms
To tell you at every moment: I love you...

(She sighs deeply and puts her hand on her heart.), G major

If only the hope of happiness, Makes my heart beat with pleasure What would happiness (itself) achieve?

2nd Couplet, g minor

Agreement, faithfulness, repose; Yes, that will be our lot; And soon pretty little kids Will embellish our union. It seems I can already see them On our knees, climbing, sitting And babbling: I love you...

(She puts her hand again on her heart while sighing most tenderly), G major

If only the hope of happiness, Makes my heart beat with pleasure What would happiness (itself) achieve?

(Spoken)

JACQUINO

(to Marceline.) At last we can chat. (Knocks on the door) Again!...it's impossible to leave this damned lodge, impossible! (He goes to open)

MARCELINE, aside.

He will no doubt speak again of his love.

JACQUINO

to Marceline.) I hope that now we'll no longer be interrupted.

No.3 Duet of Jacquino and Marceline: "Mon p'tit bijou, ma p'tite belle", Andante con moto, 2/4, C major

JACQUINO

My little jewel, my little beauty, I would love to chat with you

MARCELINE, always working

Well, what do you want of me?

JACQUINO

But you mustn't be cruel.

MARCELINE

Speak; what do you want of me?

JACQUINO

For a long time I have been pining after your charms.

MARCELINE, slyly

Really!

JACQUINO

It is like a fire, like a delirium.

MARCELINE
Really!
JACQUINO
Well, to make it short, I love you; and would like to be loved in return: Is it clear?
MARCELINE
I understand you well.
JACQUINO
Take my heart and give me yours.
MARCELINE
Wait a moment; we must come to an understanding!
JACQUINO
Well?
(One knocks at the entrance door)
MARCELINE, smiling
Someone is knocking, go, don't make him wait

ENSEMBLE

MARCELINE, aside

He is always making sheep's eyes at me

Ah, rats, what a bother!

JACQUINO Ah, rats, how unfortunate Just when love was doing well

MARCELINE, while Jacquino goes to open the door.

Who?, I, I would become his wife! To love, to happiness, I, I should renounce! No, no, I feel that in my soul, Fidelio reigns forever.

JACQUINO, returning after having opened and closed the door.

Let's get back to our business... I will love you very faithfully.

MARCELINE

As for me, I shall marry Only he who will know how to please me.

JACQUINO, giggling

If that is all it takes, I will please you.

MARCELINE

It is sometimes difficult to do.

JACQUINO

When you will be my housewife, I will caress you, I will pamper you, I will please you,

I will be so kind, so docile and so tender!...

(One knocks again at the entrance door)

MARCELINE, smiling

Someone is knocking, go, don't make him wait

ENSEMBLE

JACQUINO Ah, rats, how unfortunate Just when love was doing well MARCELINE, aside
He is always making sheep's eyes at me
Ah, rats, what a bother!
